The City of San Diego Environmental Services Department will be expanding its automated trash collection service to an additional 5,800 households in Point Loma and Ocean Beach beginning Aug. 10. According to City Services, automated refuse collection is projected to save the city of San Diego \$18 million over a 10-year period. The faster and more efficient collection is safer, reducing the number of injuries to trash collectors.

Residents are scheduled to receive the new, city-issued trash bins between Aug. 3 and Aug. 10. Residents will know the date about to switch to the new service upon receiving information in the mail.
